Gordon Hunter, who at that time was a Professor at Lethbridge University in Canada initiated a dialogue with SAP to create an academia-industry alliance. This gave birth to the Information Institute. SAP, University of Nevada Las Vegas, University of Detroit Mercy and a handful of other organizations joined hands to formally create a non-profit entity - The Information Institute. It was later organized as a 501(c)3 entity and gained a tax-exempt status. Over the years the Institute got involved with several conferences and workshops.

In 2012 the Information Institute entered into a strategic relationship with the Universidade Técnica de Lisboa, Portugal to offer an International DBA/PhD program in a hybrid format. 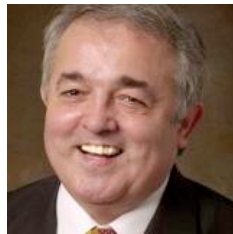
